SPRING TESTING

Primary I and II will have their individual ABC and Handwriting Evaluations administered in the week of March 13th through March 31st. Three year olds are completing the Baby LP program and know their letters, sounds, blending, and handwriting.

Primary III, IV, Elementary and Middle school students will be taking the ITBS (Iowa Tests of Basic Skills) in the week of March 27th-31st. Primary students have been extending their reading and writing skills during this year.

Testing will determine the progress of each child and what curriculum will be best for them next year in their current development. Testing conferences will be scheduled with parents who are planning for next year.
